RESULTS OF EXAMINATION:

no notation that these were typed by A-E method on "B DEce" in notes

- Item #1 - The stains were identified as human blood. Tests indicate the type is B DEce.
- Item #2 - Both the bra and the white uniform contained blood stains. Some of the stains were diluted blood stains. In addition, a clump of hair consistent with head hair samples from the victim was found inside the uniform.
- Item #3 - Stains on the pillow case were identified as human blood. Further tests indicate the type is B Rh positive.
- Item #4 - The liquid was identified as human blood. Further tests indicate the type is B DEce.
- Item #5 - No evidence of seminal fluid was found. A white animal hair and a head hair was recovered. Blood stains were noted on both the panties and the panty hose. In addition, a cut across the front of the panties at the top of the crotch area was noted. No cuts or tears were noted on the panty hose.
- Item #6 - The sample contained two (2) non-filter type cigarette butts. Saliva residue on these cigarette butts was either insufficient in amount for testing or from a non-secretor.
- Item #8 - Stains on the watch were identified as human blood. Further tests indicate the type is B Rh positive. In addition, the presence of a small amount of the A factor was also noted. ?
- Item #9 - Three (3) slits were noted in the quilt. One (1) approximately 5/8 of an inch long, one (1) approximately one (1) inch long and the third approximately 3/3 of an inch and not through all layers of the quilt.

The debris from the fitted sheet included a hook consistent with those on the bra, dried skin and a bloody Kleenex. In addition, Caucasian head hairs were recovered.

- Item #16- Tests on each of the stains indicate the presence of human blood. The amount was insufficient for typing.
- Item #17- Stains on the towel were identified as human blood. Tests for blood type were inconclusive. Rh+
- Item #18- No visual evidence of blood was noted on the blade. However, tests indicate the presence of human blood. The blade is approximately one (1) inch wide.
- Item #20- The sample contained three (3) non-filter Lucky Strike cigarette butts and one (1) non-filter unidentified as to brand. Tests on each of these cigarette butts indicate the saliva residue is insufficient in amount for testing or is from a non-secretor.

- 12/8/76 Item #21- Tests indicate the blood is type B DEca EAP-BA.
- Item #22- The results of these tests will be reported at a later date. *WHY? Testing done 12/8/76*
- Item #23- The debris from the hands contained hairs. *N. Notes*
- 12/8 Item #24- No evidence of blood was found on the knife.
- Item #25- No evidence of blood was found on the floor mat.
- 12/18 Item #26- A small stain on the front center of the shirt was identified as human blood. Further tests indicate the type is B EAP-BA.
- Item #27- No evidence of blood was found on the pedals.
- 12/22 Item #28- A small splash on the toe of each shoe was identified as human blood. Tests for blood type were inconclusive. No blood was found on any of the other items. *Worked A/B in control*
- Item #29- No evidence of blood was found on any of the items.
- 2/3 Item #30- Tests indicate the secretions are type O. - *O neg notes*

Prosecutor 'Done In by Cat'; Man Is Acquitted

of Ashland has been acquitted of murder charges in Hanover County Circuit Court because, as the prosecutor put it, "the commonwealth has been done in by a cat."

His day long trial yesterday was his second. The jury was unable to reach a verdict during his first trial on Nov. 9.

But the jury never heard the entire case yesterday. Following Commonwealth's Atty. Patrick R. Bynum Jr.'s presentation of his evidence yesterday afternoon, Circuit Court Judge Edward P. Simpkins Jr. told Bynum, "If that's all you have, you sure couldn't base a conviction on it."

With that, Judge Simpkins set aside the prosecution's evidence, acquitted and sent everyone, including home.

Bynum had attempted to convince the eight-man, four-woman jury that who also was a resident of the Holly Court Motel, had helped the other two men kill after she discovered they had stolen money from the motel's cash register.

Who were arrested in Minnesota soon after the murder. was not arrested until last July. He had continued to live at the motel until his arrest.

said he left the two men with before the violence began and went to his own room, and found He out about the murder only after the State Police arrived at the motel.

Using nine witnesses, Bynum

tried to prove had been part of the murder by showing that two of hairs were found on dress, and that a small quantity of blood similar to was found on her watch.

But under cross-examination from attorney, Tom Jones hmond, a state forensic scientist said the substance found on watch wasn't necessarily blood. Mrs. Mary Jane B ton said the substance could have been saliva sweat or blood from house cat.

She had tested the cat, Mrs. Burton said, and when tested in

a certain manner, secretions from the cat produced the same test results as blood.

As for the hairs similar to found on coat, evidence showed by could have fallen onto the coat when brushed against earlier in the day.

"Even believing every piece of evidence you have presented, I don't think you've got enough," Judge Simpkins said. "If the jury brought in a conviction, I'd have to reverse it."

With that, and his lawyer clasped each other in happiness, and the trial was over.

Motel Slaying

Saying that they were at least partially based on what amounted to hearsay evidence, the Virginia Supreme Court reversed yesterday the second-degree murder convictions of two men accused in the December 1975 killing of an Ashland motel operator.

The court said [redacted] a Baltimore man who received 10 years in prison in the case, and [redacted], who received 20 years, must be released or retried.

The pair were charged in the stabbing death of [redacted], whose partially clothed body was found in her apartment at the Holly Court Motel in Ashland on the evening of Dec. 2, 1975.

A key to the prosecution's case against the two men was a blood-stained shirt police obtained from [redacted]'s wife in Baltimore several days after the stabbing. [redacted] gave the shirt to a policeman after he asked her for the clothing her husband was wearing when he returned from Ashland on the day of the killing.

Introduced as Evidence

The shirt was introduced as evidence against [redacted] and [redacted] his brother-in-law. A serologist, Mary Jane Burton, testified that blood on it could have been the victim's.

Mrs. Burton said that the blood types she found on the shirt are shared by only about 4.7 per cent of the general population.

The Supreme Court's opinion, written by Chief Justice Lawrence W. I'Anson, came in the [redacted] case and was

adopted by the full court to dispose of the [redacted] case as well. The chief justice said the shirt was introduced by the prosecution "for the purpose of showing that the shirt not only belonged to Stevenson but was in fact worn by him on the day of the crime."

Convictions Voided

Mistrial Declared In Retrial

A mistrial was declared yesterday in Hanover Circuit Court as the retrial was about to begin for a Baltimore man charged with murdering a Hanover motel manager in 1975.

Judge Richard H.C. Taylor granted the defense motion for a mistrial following a brief conference in his chambers with Commonwealth's Attorney Patrick R. Bynum Jr. and C. Willard Norwood, the attorney for [redacted].

Just before the conference, a juror had asked to be excused from the trial because of a nervous condition, for which she said she was taking tranquilizers. Taylor pointed out that he could no longer replace her because the jury already had been selected and all unneeded members of the jury panel already had been excused for the day.

After dismissing the jury and declaring a mistrial, Taylor reset the case to be tried Tuesday.

Convicted in 1976

[redacted] and his brother-in-law, [redacted] were convicted by juries in 1976 of second-degree murder in connection with the stabbing death of [redacted]. [redacted] was sentenced to 10 years in prison and [redacted] to 20 years.

But the Virginia Supreme Court ordered the pair released and retried last year, ruling that their convictions were partially based on what amounted to hearsay evidence.

[redacted] partially clad body was found stabbed and beaten the evening of Dec. 2, 1975, in her apartment at the Holly Court Motel on U.S. 1 near Ashland.

A key to the prosecution's case in 1976 against [redacted] and [redacted] was a blood-stained shirt police obtained from [redacted] wife in Baltimore several days after the stabbing. [redacted] gave the shirt to police after being asked for the clothing her husband was wearing when he returned from Ashland the day of the killing.

Testimony at the trials tied the blood on the shirt to the victim, [redacted]. But the high court ruled that the shirt was introduced as evidence without a proper foundation, since [redacted] had not accompanied her husband on his trip to Ashland that day.

A date for a new trial for [redacted] is to be set next week. Both men are free on bond.

New Trial Inexplicably Continued

The new trial of [REDACTED] a Baltimore man charged with murder in the slaying Dec. 2, 1975, of a Hanover County motel manager, was continued without explanation yesterday until Sept. 11.

What had been expected to be a two-day trial began behind closed doors, as Hanover Circuit Judge Richard H. C. Taylor ordered the public and the press excluded from the questioning of prospective jurors.

[REDACTED] attorney, C. Willard Norwood, had asked the judge to keep the entire trial closed to the public. But after about a half-hour of the closed-door session, the jury panel was excused and Taylor continued the case.

Taylor, Norwood and Hanover Commonwealth's Attorney Patrick R. Bynum Jr. would not give a reason for the trial's delay.

Last week, Taylor had declared a mistrial in [REDACTED] case after a juror had asked to be excused from service because of a nervous condition. The jury already had been selected.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were convicted of second-degree murder in 1976 in the connection with death of [REDACTED] whose partially clothed body was found, beaten and stabbed, in her apartment at the Holly Court Motel in Ashland. Two juries sentenced [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to 10 years and 20 years in prison, respectively.

But the Virginia Supreme Court overturned the convictions in October and ordered a new trial for both men. The state high court ruled that their convictions had been based on evidence improperly introduced in the trial.

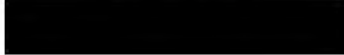

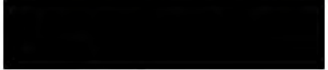
